Did you know?

Invasive species are not native to the Falkland Islands and breed and spread readily. They are prone to taking over natural environments and causing issues for our health, economy and biodiversity.

Calafate (Berberis microphylla)



Creeping Thistle (Cirsium arvense)



Spear Thistle (Cirisum vulgare)



Heather (Calluna vulgaris)



Mouse-eared Hawkweed (Pilosella officinarum)
