



The 2020/21 Falkland Islands Government Budget is the third Budget of the current Legislative Assembly.

It aims to deliver continuity in delivering our capital plans, driving improvements in public services, and stability at a time of global uncertainty created by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Budget proposes maintaining the current level of expenditure on the delivery of front-line services, on-going economic support measures, key social programmes to provide stability, benefit the wider community and respond to COVID-19.

We continue to invest in our people, with upward adjustments in wages, and welfare payments and no rises in fees and charges. We continue to invest too through our capital programme and support businesses - two key ingredients in sustainable growth in our economy.

The Budget once again is based on a prudent approach to expenditure, maintaining reserves, and the existing capital programme.

Total Budget for 2020/21

Our total Operating Budget for 2020/21 is £81.7m, with a capital transfer budget of £29.1m

This includes the operating cost of running the Government and local services, and investments in new buildings, roads and technology

These figures are in addition to money that we are carrying over from 2019/20. COVID-19 support measures are £9m in 2019/20 and a further £4.8m in 2020/21.

Investing in our community

We're spending £25.3m on health and wellbeing services; this includes hospital improvements and the next stage in the new Tussac House development.

We're helping families with inflationary increases across all welfare allowances and from January 2021 and raising the living wage for everyone. We're also keeping fees and charges unchanged beyond those announced in the last Budget.




We're funding further scientific research to assist progress with shared fisheries conservation and data exchanges.

Falkland Islands as one of nature's last pieces of paradise.






