



AIR NAVIGATION (OVERSEAS TERRITORIES) ORDER 2013

DIRECTION

Pursuant to a designation by His Excellency the Governor and in accordance with Article 68 of the Air Navigation (Overseas Territories) Order 2013 (the Order), the Director of Civil Aviation issues the following **Direction** to all operators of small unmanned aircraft (SUA) in the Falkland Islands with effect from the 24th of November 2020 until such time as it is varied, suspended or revoked.

It is directed that:

1. SUA must not be flown at a height of more than 400 feet (122 metres) above the surface.
2. Article 73 of the Order, Regulation of small unmanned aircraft, applies to SUA operators in its entirety, except that no small unmanned aircraft is to exceed a height of 400 feet (122 metres) above the surface.

Take Note:

It is a criminal offence to contravene terms of this Direction.

Information

Small Unmanned Aircraft (SUA) are also commonly referred to as drones, quadcopters, small unmanned surveillance aircraft and unmanned aerial vehicles, etc.

A person who needs to fly a SUA contrary to this Direction must obtain written permission from the Director of Civil Aviation after the submission of a satisfactory safety case.

This Direction is issued in addition to the existing Regulations that apply to SUA operations (see www.airsafety.aero/sua).
