LICENCE PART 2

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

TARGET SPECIES

Illex argentinus AND Martialia hydesi

A. Fishing Area

A1. The licensed vessel must not proceed through a closed area for transit purposes **unless** all fishing gear are stowed in such a way as to be unavailable for use.

B. <u>Issues relating to Crew Safety</u>

B1. It is the responsibility of the Master and Officers on board to monitor crew to ensure that they wear the appropriate safety gear/protective clothing for the work they are undertaking.

C. <u>Unbaited Lures</u>

C1. All lures must be unbaited. The use of baited lures to catch either fish or seabirds is strictly prohibited.

D. Seabirds

- D1. No seabirds are to be captured, harmed or killed.
- D2. Seabirds are the most threatened family of species in the world. The Falkland Islands has strict laws to protect all seabirds and marine mammals. It is a criminal offence to capture, harm or kill seabirds or marine mammals in the Falkland Islands, punishable by a fine of up to £4,000. The Falkland Islands Fisheries Department is actively enforcing the laws to protect seabirds and marine mammals.
