Recommendation paper

Title: Changes to 'A' (Hake) licence fishing season - 2022

Date: 7th December 2021

Report of: Director of Natural Resources

1. Background:

- 1.1. Historically the fishing period for the 'A' licence has been for the whole year the 1st January to 31st December but this changed in 2020 to reflect a shorter fishing season of 1st March to 15th October.
- 1.2. Prior to 2020, the target species for this licence type were *Merluccius hubbsi* and *Merluccius australis*, Southern Blue Whiting (*Micromesistius australis*), Hoki (*Macruronus magellanicus*), Red cod (*Salilota australis*), Kingclip (*Genypterus blacodes*) and Rock cod (*Patagonotothen ramsayi*). During 2020 and 2021 the target species were only Hake *Merluccius hubbsi* and *Merluccius australis*.
- 1.3. Changes in 1.1 and 1.2 above were agreed with industry in 2019 in order to avoid a reduction in vessel units (fishing effort), which had been the other possible alternative.
- 1.4. The Falkland Islands Government commissioned an independent review of the Finfish fishery and MacAlister Elliot & Partners (MEP 2020) were appointed to undertake this work. The focus of the review was to consider moving finfish allocations from a system of Total Allowable Effort (TAE) to a system of Total Allowable Catch (TAC) or improving the system of TAE.

2. **Presentation and consultations:**


- 2.1. During the 2021 June and September Fisheries Advisory Committee (FAC), DONR introduced proposals to establish a new management structure for FI finfish trawl licences based on the MEP review.
- 2.2 This new system uses ICES stock assessment modelling to determine the TAC on a stock by stock basis. These TACs are converted into TAE (Vessel Units) to ensure operational management on a TAE basis can continue. Spatial and temporal management tools were also reviewed and amended as part of this process.
- 2.3 Presentations were made by Senior Stock Assessment Scientist Dr Andreas Winter to both Fisheries Advisory Committee meetings regarding Licensing Advice and Management Proposals for 2022.

- 2.5 Various individual meetings were held by DONR with stakeholders on a company by company basis, as requested, to discuss possible impacts of introducing the changes.

3. Recommendation:


- 3.1. To change the fishing season to revert to 1st January to 31st December 2022
- 3.2 For the target/permitted species, to revert to ALL finfish (except Skate, Toothfish and Grenadier)
- 3.3 To increase the vessel units available for fishing companies with 'A' ITQ, in line with the Catch Entitlement levels approved for 2022 Licensing Advice.


Falkland Islands Conservation Zones Valid Fishing Areas: Licence Category A 01-Sep to 30-Sep


Falkland Islands Conservation Zones Valid Fishing Areas: Licence Category A 01-Oct to 16-Oct
